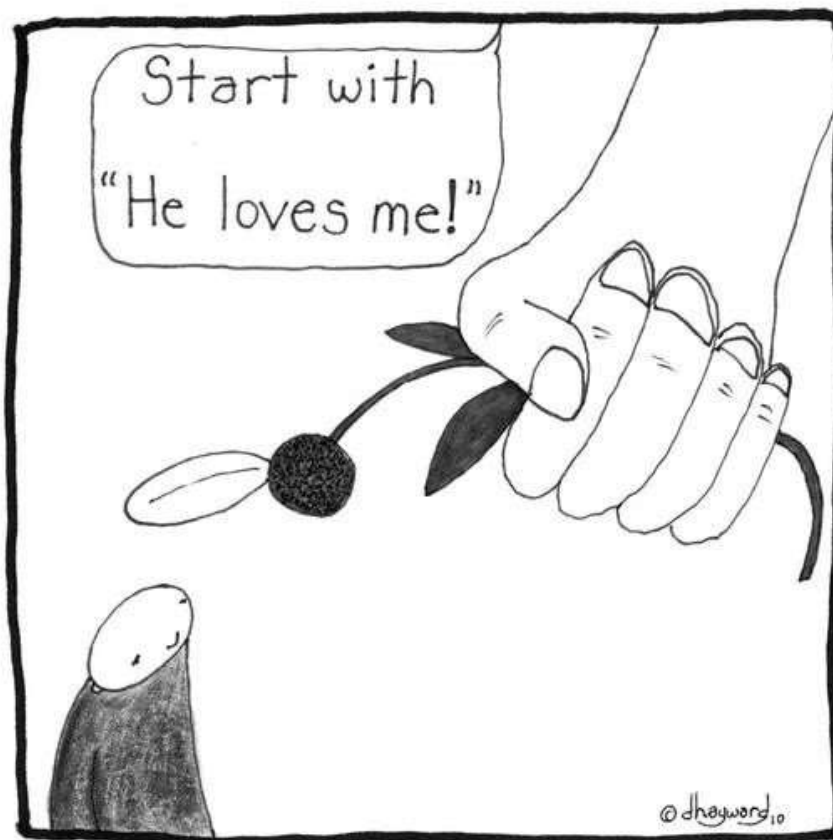

Canned meat: Holiday, Klik, flakes of ham, chicken, turkey, tuna, and salmon,

Meals: Kraft Dinner, Canned Pork & Beans, Puritan Stews, and Chef Boyardee Ravioli.
