

#### Sacred Dance:

\*Although deeply rooted in both Hebrew and Aboriginal traditions, we realize that many Christians have not experienced dance as a dimension of worship and form of prayer. In addition to the account of David dancing with all his might before the ark of the Lord, the Psalms contain several invitations to praise God in the dance. The Trinity is described among some of the church fathers as  $\pi \epsilon \rho_l \chi \dot{\omega} \rho \eta \sigma_l \varsigma$  (perichoresis) – something like 'circle dance' – a movement of creative love into which we, and all creation, are invited again.
