Our Children and Our Youth

One of the values of Gathering Table is Formation as members of Christ's Body... In our description of this value, we state that "We also introduce, nurture, and incorporate those seeking life in Christ into the same way of living through a flexible but deliberate process involving worship, scripture, reflection, prayer, relationship building, service and hospitality." We encourage everyone to implement this value, particularly by extending hospitality to our Children and Youth. While we have an excellent Sunday School program, including and welcoming children goes beyond that by making them feel welcome and an integral part of our faith family. It means including them in all aspects of our church life for example, if they are interested in helping at coffee time, find ways to include them; if there are other "tasks" or appropriate activities, we need to encourage their involvement. It is important for our youth and children to develop a feeling of belonging and of long term involvement in our church. An important ministry in Gathering Table and in our Deanery is Camp Gitchigomee, a place to both introduce and nurture the youth in our faith community. Many of us are no longer agile enough to participate in the activities of the camp but we can support through our interest, prayers and our donations.
