PWRDF UPDATE RE: ETHIOPIA

PWRDF continues to support the people of Ethiopia, particularly those in Tigray. Due to a blockade backed by the government, foreign aid has not reached Tigray for over two years and COVID restrictions have impacted food security and health. In April 2022, PWRDF allocated \$90,000 to an ACT Alliance appeal to support those

affected and will build on past work of the Lutheran World Federation, through the ACT Alliance. It will support safe water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) for those who are most vulnerable, especially people who have fled to safety. LWF Ethiopia will be working in the newly established Seba Care IDP camp in Mekelle, prioritizing WASH and protection services in "Block M." The funds will be used to extend the pipeline that LWF is laying to the existing and new water points in Block M, benefitting approximately 1,500 people and the host community living nearby, estimated at 300,000 households.
