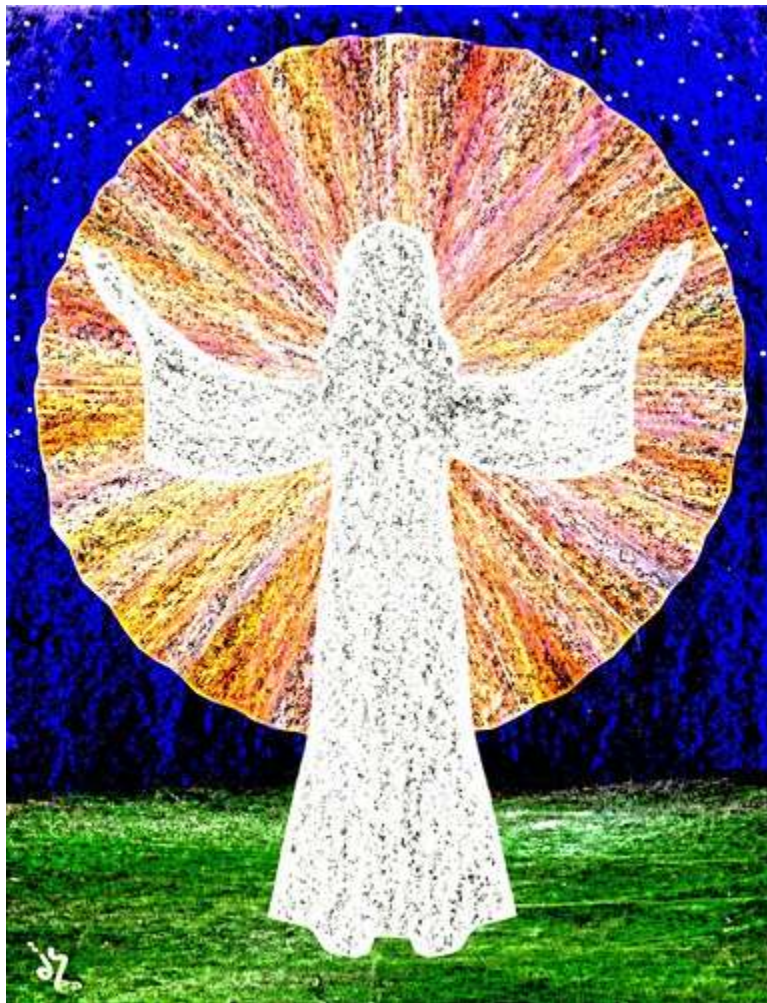

## **PWRDF Responds to Syrian/Turkish Earthquake**

PWRDF joins with ACT Alliance's (Action by Churches Together) on the ground response to the earthquake in Syria/Turkey by sending an initial \$35,000 . ACT member the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Antioch and All the East-Department of Ecumenical Relations and Development (GOPA-DERD) is providing food, blankets, mattresses and medical aid in affected communities in Aleppo, Hama and Latakia. Another ACT member, the Middle East Council of Churches, has put their resources at the disposal of the affected since the first moments of the disaster. Plans are underway from other ACT members to supply winterization materials, ambulances, and other needed supplies as the extent of the need is known.
