Genesis 3: Creation's Fall

Genesis 3:8-13

8 They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden.

9 But the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?'

10 He said, 'I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.'

11 He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?' 12 The man said, 'The woman whom you gave to be with

me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate.'

13 Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent tricked me, and I ate.'

22 Then the Lord God said, 'See, the man has become like one of us, knowing good and evil; and now, he might reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever'—

23 therefore the Lord God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from which he was taken.
24 He drove out the man; and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim, and a sword flaming and turning to guard the way to the tree of life.

⁶ For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

⁷ His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his Kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onwards and for evermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

Reading 3 Luke 1: 26 – 38 The Promise to Mary

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth,

²⁷ to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary.

²⁸ And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you.

- ²⁹ But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be.
- ³⁰ The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God.
- ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus.
- ³² He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David.
- ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob for ever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.'
- 34 Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?'
- ³⁵ The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God.
- ³⁶ And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren.
- ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God.'
- ³⁸ Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her.

Reading 4

Carol:

Matthew 1: 18 - 23 The Promise to Joseph

- ¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit.
- ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly.
- ²⁰ But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.
- ²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.'
- ²² All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:
- ²³ 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel', which means, 'God is with us.'

Luke 2: 1-7 The Birth of the Messiah

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered.

- ²This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria.
- ³ All went to their own towns to be registered.
- 4 Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David.
- ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.
- ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child.
- ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Reading 6

Luke 2: 8 – 16

The Shepherds and the Angels Come

- ⁸ In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night.
- ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.
- ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people:

- ¹¹ to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord.
- ¹² This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.'
- ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,
- ¹⁴ 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!'
- ¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.'
- ¹⁶ So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger.

- ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

- ⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- ⁷ He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.
- ⁸ He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.
- ⁹ The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.
- ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him.
- ¹¹ He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him.
- ¹² But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God,
- ¹³ who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.
- ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.
