The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading is from

1 Kings 2: 10 - 12, 3: 3-14

Then David slept with his ancestors, and was buried in the city of David. The time that David reigned over Israel was forty years; he reigned seven years in Hebron, and thirty-three years in Jerusalem. So Solomon sat on the throne of his father David; and his kingdom was firmly established. Solomon loved the Lord, walking in the statutes of his father David; only, he sacrificed and offered incense at the high places. The king went to Gibeon to sacrifice there, for

that was the principal high place; Solomon used to offer a thousand burnt offerings on that altar.
